The Electoral Boundaries Commission for Nova Scotia, established in accordance with Section 3 of the Electoral Boundaries Readjustment Act, 13 Elizabeth II, chapter 31, Statutes of Canada 1964, respectfully submits its report pursuant to Sections 12, 13 and 18 of the said Act.

The Commission held its first meeting at Halifax, Nova Scotia, on January 22nd, 1965. At this meeting the Commission appointed Mr. Donald D. Anderson, of Halifax, Nova Scotia, as its Secretary.

The Representation Commissioner, in accordance with Section 12 of the said Act, calculated eleven (11) members of the House of Commons to be assigned to Nova Scotia, as per statement dated November 24th, 1964, published in the Canada Gazette dated Ottawa, Saturday, November 28th, 1964.

The Representation Commissioner, in pursuance of Section 11 of the said Act, sent to the Chairman of the Commission a copy of the return certified by the Dominion Statistician showing the population of Canada and of each of the provinces, and the population of Canada by electoral districts as ascertained by the census taken in the year 1961, which said copy of the return was received by the Chairman of the Commission on January 23rd, 1965.

The Commission, in pursuance of Section 13 (a) of the said Act, calculated the electoral quota for the Province of Nova Scotia to be 67,001.

In compliance with Section 8 of the Representation Commissioner Act, 12 Elizabeth II, chapter 40, Statutes of Canada 1963, the Representation Commissioner supplied to the Commission maps with alternative proposals respecting the boundaries of the electoral districts in Nova Scotia. These proposals were carefully considered by the Commission. Although found to be helpful, they were not adopted.

The Commission then prepared numerous maps dividing the province into various electoral districts, trying to find one map which basically was in accordance with Section 13 of the *Electoral Boundaries Readjustment Act*. The Commission adopted a map with the descriptions of boundaries as published in the *Canada Gazette* on May 22nd, 1965, and in all the daily newspapers published in Nova Scotia on May 22nd, 1965.

In accordance with Section 17 of the Electoral Boundaries Readjustment Act, the advertisement published in the said issue of the Canada Gazette and in the daily newspapers published in Nova Scotia gave notice of the time and place for the hearing of representations from interested persons. The advertisement also stipulated that notices in writing of the representations must be given to the Secretary to the Commission within twenty-three (23) days from the date of publication as required by subsection (4) of the said Section 17.

The Commission heard eleven (11) representations at its sittings. The times and places of the sittings of the Commission were as follows:

SCHEDULE A

Descriptions of the boundaries of the electoral districts

The Commission proposes that there shall be in the province of Nova Scotia eleven electoral districts, named and described as follows, each of which shall return one member.

In the following descriptions reference to roads, water features or railways signifies the centre line of said roads, water features or railways unless otherwise described; and reference to "South", "West" or "East" signifies true courses.

- 1. ANNAPOLIS VALLEY consisting of:
- (a) the county of Kings and that part of the county of Hants contained in the Municipality of West Hants;
- (b) that part of the county of Annapolis bounded by a line commencing at a point situated on the shore of the Bay of Fundy at the northern termination of the Annapolis - Kings county line; thence westerly and along the various courses of the shore to the northern termination of Bay Road near Phinney Cove; thence southerly following said road to the highway at Upper Granville; thence southerly in a line crossing the Annapolis River to the mouth of Messenger Brook; thence along said brook and Hooper Brook to its source; thence southerly in a line to the northeast end of Goldsmith Lake; thence southerly in a line to Goldsmith Lake Brook; thence southerly along said brook to Dalhousie West Road; thence southwesterly in a line to the northern end of Dargie Lake; thence southeasterly in a line to the northern end of Lynch Lake; thence southerly in a line to Lynch Lake Creek; thence southerly along Lynch Lake Creek to the northwestern end of Allison Lake; thence easterly and northeasterly along the northern shore of said lake, the brook out of Gull Lake, and the western shore of Gull Lake to the northern end of Gull Lake; thence northeasterly in a line to the north end of Munroe Lake and continuing to Croker Lakes; thence southeasterly along Croker Lakes, Croker Lakes Creek, Alma Lake, and Alma Lake

Creek, to the east end of Beaver Lakes; thence southeasterly in a line to Durland Lake at its northeast end; thence along the eastern shore of Durland Lake and Round Lake Brook to Round Lake; thence along the western shore of Round Lake to the Annapolis-Queens county line; thence northeasterly following the Annapolis-Queens and Annapolis-Lunenburg county lines to its intersection with the Annapolis-Kings county line; thence northwesterly following said county line to the point of commencement; together with all offshore islands or parts of islands.

2. CAPE BRETON—EAST RICHMOND consisting of:

- (a) that part of the county of Cape Breton bounded by a line commencing at a point situated on the shore of Fourchu Bay at the southeastern termination of the Cape Breton - Richmond county line; thence northwesterly following said county line to the midway point of East Bay; thence in a straight line to the head of East Bay; thence northeasterly to the west end of Blacketts Lake: thence northeasterly along the south shore of Blacketts Lake, the south bank of Sydney River and the shore of the South Arm of Sydney Harbour to the southwestern boundary of the city of Sydney; thence southeasterly, northeasterly and northwesterly along the boundaries of the city of Sydney to the shore of Sydney Harbour; thence northerly and along the various courses of the shore of Sydney Harbour to the shore of the Atlantic Ocean; thence southeasterly and along the various courses of the said shore to the point of commencement; together with all offshore islands or parts of islands:
- (b) that part of the county of Richmond bounded by a line commencing at a point situated on the shore of Fourchu Bay at the southeastern termination of the Cape Breton-Richmond county line; thence northwesterly following said county line through Irish Cove to its intersection in Bras d'Or Lake with the Cape Breton-Richmond and Inverness-Richmond county lines; thence southerly to St. Pe-
